2. Qualifications

Under Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act, (1) foreign applicants holding a 'Certificate of Eligibility' or (2) foreign applicants who will be issued a Certificate of Alien Registration after admission, must meet one of the following requirements.

However, it shall be pointed out foreign applicants who have graduated (or will graduate) from universities in Japan shall take another entrance procedure, which is the same as that for Japanese applicants.

- (1) Those who have completed 16 years of schooling abroad or will complete the final year by March 31, 2009.
- (2) Those who are recognized or will be recognized by March 31, 2009 as having academic ability of bachelor's degree level through correspondence courses by foreign institutes inside Japan.

- (3) Those who have completed or are expected to complete, by March 31, 2009, specialized training colleges in Japan recognized by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology separately after the date designated by the Minister. This applies only to programs where the program duration is at least 4 years and the program complies with requirements determined by the Minister.
- (4) Those who have received schooling in another country where the number of years in the curriculum of the school education to graduate school is less than 16 years and have postgraduate qualification by engaging in research activities at institutions (a university or a laboratory) located in Japan or abroad at least one year, and will be 22 years old as of March 31, 2009.
- (5) Those who have been considered to be equivalent to or surpassing the academic level of a 4-year course of the NIT through individual screening of entrance qualifications on campus.

Those who intend to apply are screened to evaluate their entrance qualifications individually. Academic transcripts from institution previously attended, professional experiences, and international activities shall be considered for screening. With a completed set of application documents for graduate school (please refer to page 4 4(2) a, b, c, d, f, h and i), the following documents shall be submitted by 4pm July 2 (Wednesday):

- The outline of the school previously attended and the school curriculum of school education
- Application form for individual screening of entrance qualifications (the form is provided by the school).

The result of screening of entrance qualifications and successive procedure to take will be conveyed to the candidate by July 9 (Wednesday)

3. Application Period in which documents must be submitted:

July 22 2008 (Tuesday) to July 25 (Friday)

Office hours will be between 9:00 AM and 4:00PM.

For applications submitted by post, a completed set of application documents must be sent by registered mail by July 25 (Friday).

4. Application Procedure

(1) Application submission

Applicants must forward all necessary documents to Examination Division no later than the deadline. In case of postal service, the documents shall be arrived in a private envelop by registered express mail. Please write **in red** on the front of the envelope as follows:

'Privately financed international graduate student application forms are enclosed.'

(3) Notes:

- (a) Applicants lacking any of the required documents shall not be dealt with.
- (b) Any documents sent in cannot be won't be returned or revised after submission under any circumstance.
- (c) The admission fee is not refundable.
- (d) Acceptance of enrollment shall be canceled, even after admission, if the applicant is will be found to have provided false information on the application documents.

5. Test ID card

The test ID card will be given to an application when application forms are brought in person. In case of application by post, the test ID will be mailed to all applicants, by using a return envelope.

6. Applicants with physical disabilities

Applicants with physical disabilities (in accordance with Article 22 Paragraph 3 of the School Education Law), who will require special consideration at the examination ets, should inquire at Examination Division by July 2, 2008 (Wednesday)

7. Selection Process

Successful applicants will be selected based on the elements of written examinations, academic transcript, and personal interview.

Applicant's top three choices for fields of research (which are shown in the applicant's application form), the results of examinations and so on, will play a key role in the selection process. There will be a possibility that applicant's second or third choice, instead of the first choice, will be successfully accepted.

(1) Examination (written examination)

(a) Tests in the field of specialty:

Examination date: August 21 (Thursday)

The written examination will consist of tests in the applicant's field of specialty. Applicants will choose question(s) out of special subjects (see appendix). The examination, questions will be presented in Japanese; but answers may be made in Japanese or English.

12 Condition for completion

(a) <u>All Departments except the Department of Techno-business</u>
<u>Administration</u>

A student will have to attend the Master degree program for at least two years, acquire at least 30 units, attend research classes, and pass the master's theses exam and the final examination.

(b) <u>Department of Techno–Business Administration</u>

A student will have to attend the Master degree program for at least two years, acquire at least 30 units, attend research classes, and pass the master's theses exam or research papers exam and the final examination.

Note:

The research paper shall have a clear research question in the special subject and the argument in a clear and creative manner to answer the question. Or

The research paper shall be technical report related to development of new products,
